



The Bingo Association donates *Sunshine Coach* to Llanishen Fach Primary School in Cardiff

Celtic Manor, Newport, 25th May 2017: A Sunshine Coach, provided by Variety, the Children's Charity, has been presented by The Bingo Association Chief Executive, Miles Baron, alongside Lisa Morgan chief operating Officer, and Jeff Harris CEO from Castle Bingo, to Llanishen Fach Primary School at Celtic Manor today. The Bingo Association were holding their Annual Golf Day at Celtic Manor, where over 70 bingo colleagues gather and also raise money for Variety.

Llanishen Fach Primary School is a mainstream school with a Special Needs Resource Base for up to 20 pupils aged 5-11 years old, who primarily need to develop their speech and language skills. The school is fully committed to integrating the children with special needs with mainstream classes. The new specially adapted minibus, with wheelchair access will be instrumental in enriching their learning experience. It will allow them to travel and attend activities with their peers. The opportunities afforded to the children will develop their social skills, independence and build their confidence for future challenges.

This Sunshine Coach is the 6th donated by The Bingo Association in the past two years thanks to the fundraising by the bingo industry and players nationwide, who smashed their target of £500,000 in support of Variety, the Children's Charity. Throughout 2015 and 2016, the funds raised by The Bingo Association's fun for Variety have also supported a number of grants for specialist, sensory and medical equipment, including a sensory room at a special needs school, powered and sports wheelchairs, provided a number of memorable days and outings for disabled and disadvantaged children across the UK.

Colleen Ettridge, Head of Fundraising at Variety, the Children's Charity said:

"We have been overwhelmed by the generosity of the Bingo Association, its

members and customers over the last two years. Since 1962, Variety has donated

over 5,400 Sunshine Coaches to schools across the UK so we can give disabled and

disadvantaged children and young people the ability to get the most out of life. I

know that this Sunshine coach will make a massive difference to the young lives at

Llanishen Fach Primary School."

Variety, the Children's Charity, believes that neither disability nor disadvantage should prevent a child from realising their full potential. Since setting up its UK division in 1949, the charity has raised over £200 million and supported over 800,000 children affected by ill health, disadvantage and disability.

With a focus on helping children make the most of their childhood, Variety the Children's Charity, provides support through four core programmes:

Mobility - providing specialist equipment including customised electric wheelchairs and bespoke Sunshine Coaches for schools ensuring children develop a greater sense of freedom and adventure

Health - equipping children's hospitals with the latest medical technology and life changing aids

Education - equipping Youth Clubs and young people's organisations – facilitating new skills and developing greater self-worth

Variety Great Days Out - providing new experiences through educational programmes and exciting outings

Variety, the Children's Charity, launched in the United States in 1928 and is the oldest international children's charity. It has divisions across 13 countries (United States, Canada, United Kingdom, Jersey, Republic of Ireland, France, Israel, Japan, Hong Kong, New Zealand, Australia, Barbados and Eastern Caribbean) helping children at the local community level.

Since its beginning, Variety has designated as "Chief Barker" the person elected by the Trustees of the Charity to act as Chairman of the Board. It is in honorary position. "Chief Barker" reflects the charity's Showbusiness roots; these included circus, from which the term emanates.

Since 2009, Variety has partnered with SportsAid to support young sporting talent from different Paralympic disciplines, by providing essential items such as sport kits and equipment, to support with travel costs and accommodation. Of the 55 disabled athletes Variety has supported, 17 were chosen as part of Team GB for the 2012 London Paralympics and included Gold Medal winners and MBE honourees Ollie Hynd and Johnnie Peacock.
